

Show Regulations

26. EE – European Show for Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits, Cavies and Cage Birds 2. EE Juvenile – European Show for Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits, Cavies and Cage Birds in Nitra / SK from 20. - 22. November 2009

The show will be bound by the Regulations for European Shows of the EE (as ratified in Piestany / SK on 19. May 2007 by the EE Annual General Meeting) and the Show Contract for the 26. EE – European Show between the European Association EE and the Show Organisers of the aforementioned 26. European Show.

7. Important

All entry forms are administered by PC, making a carbon copy superfluous.

All breeds and collections, within **each section**, can be entered on one and the same entry form. Entry forms can be downloaded from the following websites: www.EEschau.eu and www.entente-ee.com

Show Regulations

Each species has to be entered on a separate entry form for Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits, Cavies and Cage Birds.

All entry forms to be sent to the official contact person of your own national association

2. Entry fees are as follows:

Please apply for all tickets for the Social evening on the entry form.

3. Participation

All adult and juvenile (4 to 18 years) members of a national association that is affiliated to the EE, can partake in this European show.

All breeds and colours that are recognised in the European standard (for rabbits and cavies); the EE Breeds list (pigeons and poultry) or the national standards of all affiliated countries (all sections) can be exhibited.

Cage Birds are entered according to the show regulations of their section.

4. Exhibits are entered, as follows:

- Single entries of Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits and Cavies.
- Collections of Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits and Cavies; i.e. 4 exhibits of one breed and in one colour. A collection contains both sexes.
- If an exhibitor enters more than 1 collection, he/she will have to enter these in sequential order on the entry form; e.g. first 4 entries is collection 1; the next four entries is collection 2 etc.
- Cage Birds are entered according to the show regulations of the Cage Bird section (separate entry form).

5. Identification of Exhibits

All exhibits have to carry an identification, as approved by the EE member states. Open rings are not tolerated. Chick marks are allowed in the Poultry section.

The maximum age of exhibits (only poultry and pigeons) is 6 years.

(At the 2009 European show, exhibits are welcomed with rings from 2004 to 2009).

Poultry and pigeons born in 2009 have to be rung with the new style rings, carrying the EE logo.

Birds from countries outside the EU, Switzerland as well as EU member states:

All birds ressorting under appendix A-B must have been issued with a CITES-Certificate (conform the EWG). Birds from the European fauna require certification allowing them to be bred in captivity. Identification of these birds is according to the rules and regulations of the EE Cage Bird section.

6. Entries to :

All entry forms are sent to the official contact person, who will forward these to the show organisers. Entry forms that are sent directly to the show organisers will be put aside.

Entry forms to be filled in in block capitals in one of the three official languages of the EE (i.e. German, English, French). Slovak and Czech entries are exempt from this rule.

The contact persons will check all entry forms on correctness of entries, before forwarding them to the show organisers. Regrettably, no alterations or late entries can be accepted.

7. Entry Fees

All entry fees are transferred to the relevant show bank account by the contact persons of the individual countries. All payments to be received by the show organisers no later than 10 days after the entries have closed. Failing this, the entries will be put aside.

8. Catalogue

The catalogue is obligatory for all adult exhibitors; juvenile exhibitors are exempt from this rule.

9. Sale stock

Sale stock can be purchased from 1pm on 20. November to 12pm on 22. November. Every exhibitor can put his/her exhibits up for sale. The sale price to be submitted in Euros. 90% of the sale price will be paid out to the seller, whereas the purchaser will be charged an extra 10% over and above the sale price.

Sold exhibits can be removed from the show immediately.

Monies from sold exhibits, belonging to foreign exhibitors (90% of the sale price) will be transferred to a national bank account of the seller's home country within 30 days after the show.

11. Awards

Exhibits will receive awards in accordance with Art. 10 of the Show Regulations for European Shows, conform the resolution of the 2007 Annual General Meeting in Piestany/SK.

European Championship – Collection -- Poultry, Pigeons and Rabbits

The best collection (see Art. 9.1 b) in each breed from all colours will win the title 'European Championship', provided that at least 4 collections from 2 countries and 3 exhibitors have been entered in that class.

The best collection is worked out on the total amount of points gained by the four individual exhibits.

In the event of individual colours fulfilling the prerequisites (i.e. at least 4 collections from 2 countries and 3 exhibitors) more 'European Championship' titles will be awarded in that breed and colour.

In order to win the 'European Championship' title, a collection must have gained at least 372 points.

In order to win a 'European Championship' title in the Cavy section, there must be at least 3 collections from a minimum of two countries and two exhibitors. In the event of individual colours fulfilling the prerequisites (i.e. at least 3 collections from 2 countries and 2 exhibitors) more 'European Championship' titles will be awarded in that breed and colour.

A minimum of 372 points must be gained.

The awarding of a 'European Championship' title in the Cage Bird section is described in their special regulations.

European Champion – Single entries – Poultry, Pigeons and Rabbits

The best exhibit in each breed from all colours will win the title 'European Champion', provided that at least 16 exhibits are present from 2 countries.

In the event of individual colours fulfilling the prerequisites (i.e. at least 16 exhibits from 2 countries) more 'European Champion' titles will be awarded in that breed.

The best of breed and colour must have gained at least 94 points.

In order to win a 'European Champion' title in the Cavy section, there must be at least 12 exhibits from a minimum of two countries.

In the event of individual colours fulfilling the prerequisites (i.e. at least 12 exhibits from 2 countries) further 'European Champion' titles will be awarded in that breed and colour.

The best of breed and colour must have gained at least 94 points.

The awarding of 'European Champions' in the Cage Bird section is described in their special regulations.

EE Medals

The EE donates one EE-medal per 400 exhibits in each section.

Specials

Every judge may award one special on every 10 exhibits in each section.

Exhibitor's Medal

Each exhibitor, who has entered a minimum of 4 exhibits in one section, is entitled to the Exhibitor's souvenir medal. This medal will be withheld if the exhibits are absent.

Donated Specials and Cash Prizes

Donated specials and cash specials can be listed on the entry form.

12. Catalogue and Handing out of Awards

Specials, catalogues and the exhibitor's medal for all foreign exhibitors will be issued by the show organisers to the contact person. All foreign exhibitors can collect these from their contact person in the country stand. All unclaimed goods will be transported to the home nation by the contact person, who will be responsible for the distribution thereof to all his exhibitors. The same goes for the monies from sale stock.

13. Judging of Exhibits

All exhibits from the poultry, pigeon, rabbit and cavies' sections will be judged according to the European standards. In all other cases, the national standard will prevail.

All cage birds will be judged according to the rules of the Cage Bird section.

14. Penning of Exhibits

Exhibits can be penned on Tuesday, 17. November from 9am to 7pm. under supervision of an appointed steward.

The return of judging cards and travelling boxes of sold exhibits is the sole responsibility of the person, who has penned the exhibits.

15. Liability

An appropriate compensation is paid for any dead exhibits, if it can be proven that the show organisers or their helpers are responsible. No other indemnification will apply. In such cases, a written confirmation will be drawn up in the section's office, signed and stamped.

Each section will have its own office.

For exhibits that perish on the way to and from the show, the show organisers will not be held responsible.

16. Advertising and Photography

No advertising in the halls is allowed, unless prior approval has been obtained from the show organisers.

Official photographers have to apply for a special photography permit from the show organisers. This permit will only be issued to accredited photographers that represent small livestock magazines.

Applications have to reach the show organisers by 20. October 2009 at the latest. The show organisers will decide when and where the photographers can operate.

It is strictly forbidden for members of the public to open pen fronts in order to photograph exhibits.
