Art 1: The show is governed by the general show rules of the SCAF and the rules of the EE Specific Breed Shows, supplemented by the present rules. It is open to all breeders of small animals. To be awarded a prize, all animals must be identified according to the regulations in force. The age limit is set by the rules of the Entente Européenne.

Art 2: Entry fees and classification.

The presentation of poultry and pigeons in pairs is not allowed.

The aviaries will only be composed of animals of the same age.

Transit cage (exchanges, etc...) *excluding judging*, maximum 2 animal per cage..... 2,00 €

Secretarial fees and compulsory Catalogue-Awards 15,00 €

Identification numbers (rings, tattoos and tags) must be included on the registration form on the day of set in.

Non-judged transit cages are intended as a service to breeders in the context of exchanges, but they are subject to the same health and show operation requirements and the animals must be identified on the entry form.

Art 3: Entries

If transferring by IBAN, mention your name, first name and Epinal 2023 on the bank title.

For young breeders (under 18 years old), please provide proof of age.

Irrevocable closing date for entries: Tuesday 10 October including.

Art 4: Health measures

A veterinary control will be carried out as soon as the animals are arrived. Any animal found to be suspect on arrival or during the show will be withdrawn and isolated, without refund of the entry fee. Exhibitors must ensure that all health guarantees imposed by the Veterinary Services of their department or country of origin are met.

A vaccination certificate issued by a veterinarian or the invoice for the purchase of the vaccine accompanied by an attestation signed by a witness is required for registration. Pigeons from the European Union, Great Britain and Switzerland must be accompanied by a health certificate for intra-community trade.

Art 5: Complaints.

Any complaint must reach the General Commissioner within 15 days after the last day of the exhibition.

Art 6: Exposition calendar.

Art 7: Judging

Jury operations will be conducted in camera and judgements will be final. The judge is sovereign in the class of subjects for which he/she is responsible. Judges and student judges will not be eligible for prizes in the category in which they officiate. The same shall apply if they participate in the Commission responsible for awarding the Grand Prix or the title of Champion.

According to the rules of the European Agreement, judges from different countries will be called upon to judge insofar as there is a non-negligible participation from their respective countries.

In EE-European Specific Breed Shows, the judging of animals is done according to the European judging system, based on the EE-European Standard.

The judges required for the judging must, if possible, have participated in the training courses at the EE or **must have** attended the training courses in the respective countries (article 6, paragraph 1 of the Regulations for European Breed Shows).

The panel of judges at each European Breed Show is led by a Lead Judge, usually from the organising country. This function will be entrusted to Mr. Jean-Jacques MENIGOZ, President of the Technical and Standards Commission of the FFC.

Art 8: Dislodging.

Sold animals may be removed immediately if their class is sufficiently represented, except for the Champions and Grand Prix which will wait until the end of the show. The dislodging will take place on Sunday 26th from 3 p.m., taking into account the distance.

Art 9: Responsibility.

The Société d'Aviculture Vosgienne will take all the necessary measures to ensure the smooth running of the event. It will ensure that the animals are cared for and guarantees that they will have food and water available for the duration of the exhibition.

Art 10: Transport.

Transport to and from the show is the responsibility of the exhibitors. There will be no return transport: all animals must be collected on Sunday by the exhibitors or by organised groups.

Art 11: Sales.

Subjects offered for sale must have the breeder price in euros on the entry form: this will be increased by 20% and will appear as such in the catalogue. All sales must go through the sales office. All offenders will be immediately excluded.

Art 12: Wristband and exhibitor catalogue

Two wristbands will be given to each exhibitor to allow him/her and a person of his/her choice to move freely around the exhibition. The catalogue will be given at the same time.

Categories without a minimum of 20 animals will not receive a Grand Prix d'Honneur. Each GPH will receive a Cup/Trophy and a plaque.

There will be no accumulation of awards for the same cage: only the highest award will be given.

A souvenir will be given to each exhibitor.

Art 14:

All exhibitors, by the simple fact of their entry, declare that they adhere to these regulations and undertake to comply with them.

Reminder of the rules of EE specific breed shows

All silver rabbits recognised throughout Europe may compete in the European Championship. For breeds not listed in the European standard and recognised in a third country, the breeder must provide the breed standard of the country of origin translated into French.

The rules for European breed shows govern the European Silver Rabbit Championship.

1: EE medals

The European Entente provides one EE medal for each presented breed.

2: EE European championship in Collection

This title can be awarded if at least 20 animals of a breed are entered. If 20 animals of the same variety are also entered, an additional title can be awarded.

The title of European Champion in Collection is calculated on the basis of the highest points of the 4 best animals of the same variety (per exhibitor). Both sexes (1/3; 2/2; 3/1) must be represented. In the event of a tie, the "tied" exhibitors will be awarded the title of European Collection Champion.

Breeds that do not reach the required number of animals (20) may be grouped together.

3: EE European championship in unit

- a) The title of European Champion in unit is awarded if there are at least 20 animals registered within each breed. The best animal shall be awarded regardless of sex.*
- b) Insofar as there are only 20 animals per breed, the title of European Champion in unit shall be awarded per breed.*
- c) If there are more than 40 animals per breed, the title will be awarded to the best male and female. The same applies to varieties with more than 40 animals.*
- d) Varieties which do not reach the required number of 20 animals may be grouped together.*
- e) For the award of the European Champion title, a minimum score of 96 is required..*

4: EE European championship in unit for young breeders (until 18 years)

At least 10 animals of one breed, if more than 10 animals are exhibited in one variety an additional title may be awarded. The title of European Collection Champion is calculated on the basis of the highest total of points for the 4 best animals of the variety (per exhibitor), both sexes must be represented. In case of a tie, both exhibitors receive the title of European Young Breed Champion. Varieties that do not reach the number of 10 may be grouped together.

5: EE European championship in unit for young breeders (until 18 years)

In the youth class, only 10 rabbits must be entered per breed or variety to have a male and female champion. If more than 20 rabbits per breed or variety are entered, then a male and female champion can be awarded.

6: Diplomas

The winners of the European Championship titles (including youth) will receive a diploma.
